These will take place on Wednesday this week. The children will all have their individual photograph taken during the school day and will have photographs taken with siblings within school.

If you have Nursery children who would not normally be in on Wednesday, and you want a photograph taking, please bring them along at 9am and they can join in with Nursery to have their photo taken. Parents will need to stay with these children and take them home after their photo has been taken.

If you have younger children that are not yet at school and you would like a sibling group photo including these children, please come to school between 8.15am and 8.30am via the main entrance so that these photographs can be taken before the start of school.

Children In Need Day

This will take place on Friday, 15th November and we are asking children to come to school in their pyjamas! Any donations towards Children in Need would be very much appreciated.

We are dressing in pyjamas as we are launching a bedtime reading project. In the homework survey that took place at the parents' evening last term, only a third of parents said that their child had a bedtime story every night. We are aiming to increase this to two thirds by Christmas and all children by the end of the year!

During the day on Friday, we will be ringing the bell to signal that it is 'bedtime' and all work will stop and an adult will read a 'bedtime story'. If your child wants to bring a blanket into school on Friday to make their bedtime story more cosy, they are welcome to do this! Further information about the importance of bedtime stories even up to Year 6 age will be following next week.

Safeguarding our children

Children have been reminded again this week about staying off the grass at playtimes, lunchtimes and during the 1k as this keeps them away from the wall. It therefore seems a good time to remind parents and grandparents that we ask that they do not stand at the wall or encourage children to approach the wall while children are in the playground. While we understand that adults are only intending to wave or say hello to the children, it puts children in a difficult position when they know that the rule is that they shouldn't talk to adults at the wall or move across the grass. We appreciate your support in keeping all our children safe.
