<p><b>Reading activities</b> including phonics practice for children in KS1</p> <p>Activities: David Walliams is releasing an audio story every day for the next 30 days <a href="http://www.worldofdavidwalliams.com/elevenses/">www.worldofdavidwalliams.com/elevenses/</a></p> <p>Read one of your favourite stories to someone in your house.</p> <p>Find a new place in your home or garden to read in.</p>	<p><b>Maths basic practice</b></p> <p>Activities: Fractions with m&amp;ms/skittles/smarties – write the fraction of each colour within the pack.</p> <p>Beach ball quick addition - <a href="http://s7657.pcdn.co/wp-content/PDFs/BeachBallParty.pdf">http://s7657.pcdn.co/wp-content/PDFs/BeachBallParty.pdf</a></p> <p>Draw a hopscotch board like this:</p>  <p>Throw two rocks onto the board, then either add or multiply the numbers together.</p> <p>Practice your measuring skills by creating a mocktail. Make a drink using at least 3 different liquids which is a total of 500ml, record your recipe to make in in your book!</p> <p>Using a pack of cards, place them face down and randomly pick two or three. Play with a partners, the first person to add them correctly wins the cards. You will need a ball and a wall or partner. Throw the ball, take a step back every time you manage to catch it. Can you throw with one hand and catch with the other?</p> <p>How many star jumps can you do in a minute? Can you improve it next time?</p>

You might want to include what you have been up to, ask what they have been doing, any new hobbies you've started and what you are looking forward to.</p> <p>Practice spellings from the Year 3/4 spelling list by writing them out in fancy letters.</p> <p>Create an advert or poster to encourage someone to visit Whitby or Halifax.</p> <p>Visit pobble365.com and complete the story starter or questions for the picture of the day.
