Other information

Pinnar Lane

Please can parents supervise their children closely while moving along Pinnar Lane particularly after picking up

from school. A few parents have shown concern about children running along this narrow lane and weaving across the road away from their parents. If your child is in Year 5 or 6 and they walk along this lane on their own, please remind them to be conscious of traffic and other road users.

Social Distancing

The morning routine seems to work very well with a steady stream of pedestrians arriving and leaving school with social distancing in place for the vast majority of people. However, please make sure that you remain at social distance from other people while waiting for your children to come out of class and while walking away from school in the afternoon. Particular care needs to be taken when approaching the crossing on Law Lane as this is the obvious place where pedestrians do have to wait until the crossing patrol lady can stop the traffic. There would be a steadier flow of traffic in the afternoon if people with older siblings delayed their arrival at school until the time when they are released. For example, if you have a child in Reception and a child in Y5, you do not need to come to school to collect both your children until 3.15pm.

EYFS Play Area

Please do not allow any of your children to play on the EYFS play equipment when picking up and dropping off. Please also move away from this area as soon as you have collected your child so that a bottle neck isn't created.

We are really pleased with how effectively we can communicate during this time with you via ClassDojo. Please can I remind you though that teachers may only see messages on ClassDojo or via email while in school and therefore they may not respond until the following day. If a message is urgent, please ring the school or speak to a member of the Senior Leadership Team in the playground before or after school.
