Information for next week

World Book Day

World Book Day is on 4th March 2021 and we will be celebrating it in style with a range of competitions and activities linked to all different kinds of books. We will be encouraging all children to dress as a book character whether at home or at school and there will be prizes for the best dressed in school and the best dressed at home.



For those at home, please send a photo to your child's teacher on the morning so that the children in school can choose the best dressed.

One activity that people at home will need to plan for is that we would like to encourage children to look through recipe books to find a recipe that they would like to make and read the instructions (probably with adult help!) to make the recipe. This will encourage children to see that the reading of instructions is an important skill but also introduces children to a different sort of book to fiction books. If you do not have any recipe books, there are lots of recipes online which you might be able to use or I have attached a recipe booklet from Noah's Ark which is designed to provide recipes which are healthy but not too costly. We would like photographs sending in of the children reading and following their recipe and their finished product so that we can make a lockdown cooking book! We are letting you know now in case you need to purchase any ingredients.

We are running an Extreme Lockdown Reading competition. Your child needs to decide on an unusual or adventurous place or situation to be reading and have a photograph taken in this location reading a book. Send the photos in to your child's classteacher to enter the competition.

We have attached with this newsletter some information about reading at home which you may find useful. We have included a book token for World Book Day which your child can spend. We have also attached a 'Who's behind the book'?' sheet which your child can have a go at.

Finally, we have attached a document which gives the blurbs from the back of lots of books. During the day on Thursday, the stories will be read via zoom meetings at the times shown. Classes in school will join the sessions to listen to some of the stories and children at home can join at any of the times shown on the document to listen to the stories. Please look through the list with your child to decide which times they are going to join at.
