# COVID arrangements

We will be keeping the children in year groups next week to reduce contact with others. We are obviously hoping that we can get through next week without any positive cases but will support Test and Trace and local public health in identifying close contacts should there be any cases. If anyone in your family tests positive on lateral flow tests, please ensure that you register these online so that they are recognised and picked up by Test and Trace.

We are continuing with the one-way system around the playground and this will be a permanent feature of our drop off and pick up procedures in the future. Please continue to wear masks, if you are able, particularly if you need to speak to a member of staff at the cloakroom door or in the office.

We will determine arrangements for September towards the end of the summer holidays and will send any information needed out to parents before we come back to school. If things continue as the government has suggested, by September, children under the age of 18 and double vaccinated adults will not have to self-isolate if they have been in contact with a positive case which should make arrangements easier to manage.

# Poetry Festival

We are holding a poetry festival in the Autumn term. This will hopefully be an annual event with all children in school learning to recite or perform a poem and finalists being chosen from each class to perform in front of a panel of judges in a final competition. We feel that this will support children's confidence in performing in front of an audience, their memory skills, their ability to retain information and their love of poetry.

We would like all children to be involved in learning or practising a poem and all children will have a chance to show us their recital or performance when we come back in the Autumn term. For those of a more nervous nature, they may perform it to an adult or a smaller group.

Each age phase will have a number of poems that they can choose from and these will come home next week so that children can practise them over the Summer holidays ready for their performance in September. Please encourage your child and support them in practising.

## Other information

## Y5 Secondary Applications

Parents of children in Y5 should have received information about applying for secondary school before the end of October. If you haven't received this, please let the office know and we can send it to you.

## Data Collection

We would normally send a copy of the contact details of parents, carers and anyone else who would collect your child at this time of year for checking. In the past, we have found that these often don't come back or very little has changed and the majority of those that are returned have no changes to make.

We have decided this year not to send these but ask you to ensure that whenever any of your details or the details of your other contacts change that you let us know immediately. This includes names, addresses, telephone numbers and email addresses where we have them.

## Separated families

In most circumstances, we send written correspondence from school to the first parent on the child's records. However, for some families, both parents request that they receive all written communication about their child and this is straightforward for us to set up.

If your circumstances are such that both people with parental responsibility would like to receive the same information e.g. text messages, emails and end of year reports, please let us know both sets of parental details for the child and that you wish for this to be established. We will need to have seen the child's birth certificate or other documentation on entry or at this point to confirm parental responsibility. We will then make these arrangements for you.
