Spotlight on enriching the curriculum

At Withinfields, we ensure that all children receive a broad curriculum covering all the subjects that are part of the National Curriculum and Early Years framework. However, we also work hard to ensure that children have opportunities which enrich their experience and education. Where there is a cost for these, we fund them through our enrichment pot which parental contributions and fundraising activities financially support. This means that we don't need to ask families to contribute to trips (except the residential), workshops in school or other events.

Some of the provision has been affected by the last two years and the lockdowns and restrictions but we are starting to get back to normal. For example, Y3 are going on their trip on Wednesday to Yorkshire Sculpture Park. This is linked to their work in art about Henry Moore and sculpture. Some of the clay sculptures that they have done this week are amazing and I'm sure that they will enjoy seeing some of the larger scale sculptures on their trip. Y1 are also holding their family learning event in a few weeks linked to their kite making topic. We are really looking forward to being able to have parents and carers in school again working alongside their children!

We aim for all children to have access to a trip, a family learning event, a workshop activity and an enterprise activity (where they learn how to raise and manage money) each year. This is in addition to local visits which they may be involved in.

Let's hope that we manage to continue with more 'normal' activities for the whole year!
