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#### News from this week Assemblies

We are focusing on new topics in our assemblies this half term. On Mondays, we are looking at how we can be good friends which also links to our Anti-bullying activities on Monday (see below). On Tuesdays, we are learning about, and from, people with disabilities. In EYFS and KS1 assemblies on Wednesdays, we are learning about different customs and festivals. In KS2 assemblies on Thursdays, we are working on projects to achieve various awards for our school.

We have had our half-termly safeguarding assembly this week where we remind everyone about the rules in the playground to keep us safe. This includes staying off the grass and not talking to adults at the wall. Please don't ever be offended if your child won't talk to you if you are passing at playtime as they know that they can give a little wave but that we don't talk to anyone at the wall. I also reminded the children about our fire evacuation procedures and our lockdown procedures.

We have started to include a poem or rhyme at the end of our assemblies. We have realised that we read lots of stories and non-fiction texts in school but don't have as much opportunity to read poetry so have started to read one poem each day so that our children are exposed to different poetry. Key Stage 2 children listened to this poem after our assembly about Remembrance yesterday:

"The inquisitive mind of a child"

Why are they selling poppies, Mummy? Selling poppies in town today. The poppies, child, are flowers of love. For the men who marched away.

But why have they chosen a poppy, Mummy? Why not a beautiful rose? Because my child, men fought and died In the fields where the poppies grow.

# Open Day for Reception 2024

We are holding three open day sessions on Thursday next week for families who may be considering joining our school for Reception 2024. If you know of families in your street who have a child who will start school next year, please let them know. The times of the three sessions are 9.30am, 1.30pm and 6pm. The sessions will involve a short introduction to the school from myself, a tour of the school including the Early Years classrooms and the opportunity to look at some children's work.

(https://new.calderdale.gov.uk/schools-and-learning/scho ols/admissions) unless you live outside the Calderdale boundaries in which case you can still apply for a place at our school but through the council in which you live.
