Assemblies this half term

Our assemblies this half term have different themes. On Mondays, we are thinking about special days and festivals including Mothers' day. On Tuesdays, we are going to be looking at different quotes which help us to learn how to live positive lives. In EYFS and KS1 assemblies on Wednesdays, we are finding out about being the best learner we can be while KS2 will be learning about different world religions on Thursdays.

We are also developing our repertoire of songs that we can sing and sign to. It is really lovely to see our children signing along to the songs that we sing.

To develop our children's exposure to poetry, we finish each assembly with a poem of the day. This was yesterday's:
