Bike and scooter safety

We have a number of our older children that are coming to and from school on their bikes. Please can you all remind your children that they should be wearing a helmet if they are riding their bikes. There have been a number of children this week who have been without helmets.

We have also been asked by the residents at the top of Withinfields to ask families to remind their children that they need to take care when crossing driveways. There have apparently been some very near misses when children have come down the pathway from Pinnar Lane to the top of Withinfields on scooters and bikes and have not slowed down to check whether residents are moving vehicles in and out of driveways.

Sporting opportunities

Mobile phones in school

In Y5/6, children should only bring their phone to school if they have walked to school without a parent in the morning or are leaving without a parent at the end of the day. Children who are accompanied to and from school do not need their phone in school. Please be aware that any child that brings a mobile phone is expected to switch it off and hand it in. These phones are kept in a storeroom but we are not responsible for any damage or loss during this time and if you are worried about this, please do not send your child with a phone.

Children in Y4 and below are not allowed mobile phones in school.

Staff have noticed that sometimes parents are on their mobile phones when collecting children. This affects the transition for your child from school to home as they do not have your full attention. All children benefit from a warm welcome from their parent or carer when they leave school and a conversation with them about their day. Some schools have gone down a no-mobile use in the school grounds which we are not intending to implement but please consider how important the 5-10 minutes at pick up are to your child in terms of 'you-time'.

Improving Attendance Information

What is good attendance?

Children who attend for 97%+ of the year have regular attendance which will enable them to learn positively and maintain progress.

Children who attend 94.6%+ of the year have attendance which is in line or above national average.

Children with attendance below 94.6% are below national average for their attendance.

Children with attendance below 90% are persistently absent and the Educational Welfare Officers from Calderdale Council discuss these children with us in their termly visit.

We will provide a copy of your child's attendance so far this year with the termly report so that you can see what percentage your child has attended so far this year.

Special Educational Needs and Disabilities information

We are having an SEND audit conducted by an external professional next week to determine which aspects of our SEND provision are strong and which need further development. We will let you know the findings once we have the report.
