 Christopher Columbus was an explorer and sailor. He made four trips to the Americas in his lifetime. Columbus is often thought to have discovered America in 1492 when actually there were already native people living there. To know what life was like in the 15th century and how it differed from life today. Christopher Columbus sailed using three ships: The Nina, The Pinta and The Santa Maria. They were powered by sails and the journey took a very long time. To know why his voyage to the Americas was so significant and how this changed people's lives in Europe. He kick-started the move of people from Europe to the Americas, what became known as the New World. His story of daring determination travelling into the unknown has inspired many adventurers since. Although often seen as a hero, recently people have changed their minds about him because they think he treated the native Indians he came across very cruelly.
