# Nativity

The performances are both on Wednesday 17th December at 9.10am and 5pm. We would appreciate it if <u>all</u> Nursery and Reception children could attend for the performance on Wednesday evening. We will send details about times for children to return etc. via ClassDojo. If your child is in Nursery and does not usually attend on Wednesdays, they are welcome to come on Wednesday morning for the Nativity performance but will need to be taken home afterwards.

Entry to the audience for the nativity will be through the hall fire door. Please ensure that you have your tickets as we need to ensure that we stick to fire regulations.

### **Christmas Parties**

On the day that it is your child's Christmas party in the final week of term, they are allowed to wear non-uniform for the day. Please remember that they will still be playing out at lunchtime and so appropriate footwear is necessary and warm clothes.

We can fund the food, drinks, prizes and presents for the parties due to your kind support towards the enrichment pot whenever we hold fundraising events.

# Christmas Carols in the playground

The children and staff will be holding a 'Carols in the playground' session on Monday 15th December from 2.30pm. If the weather is not fine, we will do this in the hall. Each age phase will sing two songs with each age phase coming out at different times. We will serve warm drinks for anyone that wants to purchase them but otherwise this event is free. ### **Christmas Favre**

It will be our Christmas Fayre on Tuesday next week. This will take place straight after school. Please collect your children from their classes as normal and then come around to the Hall fire door for entry into the Christmas fayre. This event is a token event and token cards can be purchased for £2.50 for 5 tokens via School Gateway or in cash at the office either prior to the event or at the event. We have had some lovely donations of gifts to purchase made by Miss Rothery's grandma and gingerbread men kindly donated by Lottie Shaw's. Children can obviously have more than one token card if they wish to have a go on more than 5 stalls or purchase more gifts.
