Buns Sponsor of the week

Our Enrichment pot, which all donations for buns goes to, pays for all school trips and special workshops within school for our children so that parents are not asked to pay for these. The events which are highlighted as green in the dates show the events that this money helps to fund.

Special mention of the week

A huge thank you to all the families who contributed to our Summer Fayre and Staff Gunging this week. We are lucky that we have such good sports on the staff that are willing to put themselves up for these types of things and that we have such a strong community that support us with whatever they can afford. The Summer Fayre raised £514.50 which will be added to the enrichment pot which pays for all the trips in school. The Gunging raised £570.59 which will be put into our Build the Boundary, Protect our Play fund which is contributing to the £47k+ cost of a perimeter fence.

Important information

We are hoping that our children do not stay up for the next England match on Monday morning but instead wait and watch it at school at 8.45am. Children can wear football themed clothes on Monday. Those who would prefer not to watch the match at 8.45am will do fun activities in class instead. Our normal times for registers will stand.

Other information

Offline challenge - Create a map of your local area. You might want to put key buildings on it or road names. You may want to go on a walk to plot your map so that you can get it just right! Older children might want to pace out distances so that they can work on it being to scale.

Sports Day - At the moment, the weather forecast for Thursday morning looks positive. Please remember that the children have the shade of the wall and therefore, if you want to protect yourself from the sun, you will need to bring a parasol or umbrella. Parents and grandparents will be asked to sit at the far side of the track so that we can safeguard all children. Please do not be offended if you are asked to move.

Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will start their sports day as quickly as we can at the start of the school day. Please ensure that your child has a full water bottle to take out with them. This should finish at about 10.15am. Nursery children who are not normally in school on Thursday are welcome to come to the event as long as an adult is also staying so that they can take them home at the end.

Years 3-6 will start their sports day at 10.30am. This should be finished at about 12noon.

If the weather is not kind to us, we will post on ClassDojo any other notices about this. Please ensure that your child is wearing their PE kit on Thursday and that they have a hat to protect their head from the sun.
